Primary PE & Sports Premium Strategy Statement 2021-2022

The PE and sport premium funding is used to improve the quality of PE and sports activities for all pupils. At Kingsholm we aim to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and realise their potential. Our vision is that all pupils leave primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport. The improvements made in the quality of PE and sport should be self-sustaining so that we at Kingsholm can continue to offer:

- The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity
- A high profile of PE and sport in school
- Staff with an increased confidence in the knowledge and skills needed to teach PE and sport
- Broad experience of a range of sports and activities for children throughout their time in school
- Opportunity to take part in competitive sports

Funding

Individual schools will receive circa £8000-£9000 per annum (depending on the number of pupils) and an additional £5 per pupil if the school has 17 or more children.

Contextual Information

Kingsholm Church of England Primary School (KPS) attracts pupils from widely differing socio-economic and cultural backgrounds and from many different faiths. Our pupils speak 32 different languages with no dominant group. They come from 20 ethnic groups and there are 10 faith groups. There are currently 608 children on role.
